## Stevens is digging in!

At Stevens Elementary School, every Friday morning it's time for The Husky Digs. It's when students participate in a class they really dig.

But these aren't your typical kinds of classes. The Stevens Elementary teachers are piloting a "Passion Class Project." They have aligned their personal hobbies to the curriculum and the result is that once a week you can find students gardening, baking, dancing, crocheting, learning origami, painting, sculpting and even learning how to invent a board game. Classes also include sign language, robotics, musical production, Spanish club and seasonal sports.

"Every teacher is involved, as well as most of the staff who have teamed up with a teacher," Principal Jamie Stotler said. "The kids love it. You can hear them on Thursdays

saying, 'Tomorrow is Friday!' It's really improved attendance because they want to be here for these classes."

The idea grew out of site visits last Spring when a group of teachers from Stevens was able to visit several innovative schools in the St. Louis, Mo., and San Diego, Calif., areas.

In addition to staff sharing their hobbies, Principal Stotler said students were also asked for ideas. And then they voted. Once the list was narrowed, each student picked three classes and they were guaranteed placement in one of their top three.

All of the classes are multi-grade and this has opened doors to new relationships between students – and between students and staff, Principal Stotler said. In the Sign Language class, for example, this visitor observed an "upper classman" teaming up with a kindergartner to learn a new sign.

When one student was asked why she elected to be in a particular class, she said, "This is not a class!"

"Oh, what should I call it?" the visitor asked.

"It's ... it's ... uh ... it's ... I don't know exactly, but it's not a class because we're not in class."
