WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO THIS YEAR?

- If you are in Jr. High, each year, you need to:
 - Do 5 hours of community service (volunteering)—have supervisor sign form
 - Do Advisory classroom work (goal setting, college and career planning, etc.)
 - In May, you will be asked to do a year end self-evaluation to turn in along with your signed service form(s). Parent volunteers will check your paperwork and your grades and let the college know if you have completed your requirements.
- If you are in High School, each year, you need to:
 - Do 10 hours of community service (volunteering)—have supervisor sign form (service hours required by AHS double as WCS service hours)
 - Do Advisory classroom work (goal setting, college and career planning, etc.)
 - In May, you will be asked to do a year end self-evaluation to turn in along with your signed service form(s). Parent volunteers will check your paperwork and your grades and let the college know if you have completed your requirements.
KEEP ALL OF YOUR WCS PAPERS WITH YOUR ADVISORY CLASSROOM FOLDER UNTIL THEY ARE REQUESTED BY YOUR WCS PARENT COORDINATOR FOR VERIFICATION TO THE COLLEGE.
- If this is your Senior Year, CONGRATULATIONS! Your final WCS paperwork will be due in March (earlier than other grade levels) in order to submit your name for recognition at graduation! If you attend another college, you may still use a portion of your WCS scholarship award toward summer or online classes through Grays Harbor College.
